

Pupil Premium Grant (PPG)

Pupil Premium funding is money sent to schools based on the numbers of pupils in the school eligible for 'Free School Meals' (FSM). From 2012-2013, this figure has included all pupils who have been eligible for the last 6 years. (FSM Ever)

The Pupil Premium funding that is received by the school annually is used in a variety of ways in order to improve pupil attainment and to help overcome any barriers to learning.

Reading - 2 children achieved expected in reading. 1 child achieved greater depth in reading.

Writing - 1 child achieved expected; 1 child achieved greater depth. 1 child was below expected in writing.

Mathematics - 2 children achieved expected and 1 child achieved greater depth.
