



# Holy Ghost Catholic Primary School

## SPORTS' PREMIUM

**Summer/Autumn/Spring 2017-2018**

**Allocated funding = £17,800 (double grant)**

At Holy Ghost, teaching in PE, and the access to a range of extra-curricular opportunities which promote healthy, active lifestyles has long been a strong aspect of our provision.

Funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport - is allocated to primary schools to improve the provision of PE and school sport. We are in the third phase of this funding, and will receive £17,800 for 2017-2018.

In line with our Mission Statement, our UNICEF Rights' Respecting agenda, and the school's provision for spiritual, social, moral, and cultural education, PE and Sport are key drivers for the development and fulfillment of each child.

The Sports Premium for the year ahead is allocated within the wider budget for PE and Sport. The Sports' Premium is allocated as follows:

### Swimming

Year 6 Swimming Squad – LSSA Relay Events –Mixed Stroke Relay team have been selected to represent London in the national Schools' Team Championships in Sheffield in June.

The swimming squad qualified for the Borough finals in 1st place. In the Borough Finals the girls' finished in 1<sup>st</sup> place and the boys' in 4<sup>th</sup>. Overall Holy Ghost finished 2<sup>nd</sup>.

Dulwich School gala and the girls continued with their winning streak and were placed 1st overall. Our boys' team came 4th.

## **Athletics**

Year 4 class represented school in the Catholic Athletics Competition organised by St John Bosco College. Holy Ghost were 2nd overall.

Quad Kids Athletics day saw our Year 5 and 6 Athletes finish 1st out of 22 schools. This meant that they qualified for the Youth Games and a chance to represent Wandsworth. They were brilliant and finished 12th out of 33 boroughs....with one extra point they would have finished 9th.

## **Cricket**

The Year 6 Boys' and the Year 5 cricket team reached the quarter-finals of their cricket competition at Spencer Club. The Year 6 girls' didn't qualify out of their section but played well. The excitement was the development of some of the less confident girls who found form and scored vital runs.

The Year 5's once again represented the school at the Maurice Fulcher cricket tournament. The team played well but should have had a better finishing place. They finishes 2nd in their section.

## **Football**

A squad of 10 Year 5 boys entered the Dulwich football invitation tournament. They won their section. They won their quarter- final and lost in the semi-final

Girls' Football B team - 4th in their section, A team were beaten in the semi-final.

The Year 6 football team entered the Chelsea Foundation Tournament this year. There were 32 schools participating. The 8 players were amazingly focussed and very skilful. They won 6 matches and drew 1. They met Penwortham in the semi final and beat them in a penalty shoot out. They met John Keble in the final and were beaten 1-0 in extra time.

For the first time we have entered a football league. This has been a good event for us - enthusiasm for football is second to none. We entered both a girls' and a boys' team who played throughout the term. The girls won the league winning all 8 of their matches. The boys' also won the league winning 9 and drawing one. It was organised by the Chelsea Foundation and we have 2 more trophies for our cabinet.

The Year 5 and Year 6 boys played football matches against St. Anselms.

## **Cross- Country**

The Wandsworth Primary X- country event saw our Year 5 boys finish 2nd in the team event. The Year 5 girls finished 5th. Year 6 boys finished 4th overall and the Year 6 girls finished 11th overall. Holy Ghost finished 5th out of 26 schools.

The Hall girls x-country with Years 3,4,5 and 6 finished 8th overall . Year 3 - 12th, Year 4 - 5th, Year 5 - 6th and Year 6 - 9th.

The Hall boys' X- country team were excellent again with our Year 3 boys finishing 3rd, Year 4 finished 8th , Year 5 finishing 1st and with our Year 6 finishing 5th

## **Tag - Rugby**

The Year 5 tag rugby team struggled to put their speed and skill into try scoring moves, they drew 2 and lost 2 only winning 1. They came 5th in their section.

The Year 6 team played 6 matches. They won 4 and drew 2. This resulted in their finishing 1st in a very tight section. They won their semi-final. The final went to extra time 3 times finally resulting in Silver Medals for the Holy Ghost.

Year 4 were involved in a Sports Festival playing Tag -rugby with St Mary's, Putney.

## **Netball**

The Year 6 netball team finished 3rd in the Battersea League having won 7 matches, lost 1 and drawn 2.

Three netball teams were entered in the Wandsworth netball tournament.

The Year 5 team lost 2 and drew 1 match. The B team played well, they won 1 , lost 1 and drew 1 but missed getting through by 1 goal. The A team won 1 and lost 1 in their section. They won their quarter -final match and were beaten in the semi-final in extra time. They went onto to win the play off, receiving bronze medals.

The Year 5 and Year 6 Girls played netball matches against St Anselms.

A Year 3 team played a netball match against Belleville.

Four Year 3 and 4 teams played netball against Honeywell.

The year 4 class were involved in a Sports Festival where they played netball against St. Mary's Putney.
