Allocated funding = £16,000

At Holy Ghost, teaching in PE, and the access to a range of extra-curricular opportunities which promote healthy, active lifestyles has long been a strong aspect of our provision.

Funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport - is allocated to primary schools to improve the provision of PE and school sport.

In line with our Mission Statement, our UNICEF Rights' Respecting agenda, and the school's provision for spiritual, social, moral, and cultural education, PE and Sport are key drivers for the development and fulfilment of each child.

The Sports Premium for the year ahead is allocated within the wider budget for PE and Sport. The pupils here benefit from an outstanding specialist PE and sports teacher; a strong curriculum for PE, and a wide range of sporting opportunities for all groups of pupils. The Sports' Premium for 2018-2019 will assist us as we continue to improve facilities and provision for PE and sport, and will be allocated as follows:

Holy Ghost has won the boys' Year 6 Wandsworth Cross- Country and the year 6 The Hall Cross - Country event, the Battersea netball league, the Wandsworth Borough netball heats and the B team won the Wandsworth Quik - Sticks hockey tournament, the Cedars Cricket Competition. The girls swimming squad won the Borough gala. The school has entered 5 festivals to encourage full participation by less engaged pupils and the following chart shows the representation of pupils who have participated in events organised this academic year.</p>

Swimming

Year 6 Swimming Squad – 4th in both ESSA freestyle and mixed stroke relays.

Athletics

Year 4 class represented school in the Catholic Athletics Competition organised by St John Bosco College. Holy Ghost were 4th overall.

Quad Kids Athletics was postponed with bad weather and re scheduled on a day our Year 5 children were on a school trip. Year 6 Athletes stepped in and finished 5th out of 22 schools.

Cricket

The Year 6 Boys' and the Year 6 girls were both disappointed to miss out on the quarter finals in their cricket competition at Spencer Club.

The boys in Year 5 travelled to Cedars School. The A team reached the semi final of their competition and the B team won the Plate competition.

Football

The girls and boys in Year 5 entered the District football competition. The boys finished 3rd and the girls finished 6th.

Netball

Holy Ghost entered a team into the La Retraite Netball tournament. We played well to get into the final, where we were drawn against a team from Lambeth who beat us 4-1.

Autumn Term 2017

Football

The Year 6 football team entered the AFC Kids Cup and the Trinity Cup this year. There were 21 schools participating in the Kids Cup - we entered 2 teams - our B team came 3rd in their section. The A team qualified for the quarter finals which they won. They lost in the semi-final and finished 3rd in the tournament. The boys lost in the semi-final in a penalty shoot-out at the Trinity Cup.

Cross- Country

In the Wandsworth Primary X- country event the Year 6 boys finished 1st overall and the Year 6 girls finished 6th overall. The Year 5 were unable to enter as they were on an over night school trip.

The Hall girls x-country with Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 finished 7th overall . Year 3 - 5th, Year 4 - 11th, Year 5 - 4th and Year 6 - 7th.

The Hall boys' X- country team were excellent again with our Year 3 boys finishing 4th, Year 4 finished 3rd , Year 5 finishing 8th and with our Year 6 finishing 1st.

Tag - Rugby

The Year 5 tag rugby team played in the Wandsworth Competition without a year 6 entry as it was Open Day at school. They finished 3rd in their section

Cricket

The Year 5 and the Year 6 teams represented the school at the Maurice Fulcher cricket tournament. The teams played well but should have had a better finishing place. They both finished 2nd in their sections.

Netball

15 Year 6 children played in the Battersea League at Sacred Heart School. Both teams played weekly over 11 weeks. The B team came 10th and the A team came 1st.

Biathlon

21 children entered the Southern region Biathlon Championships.

Spring Term 2018

Gymnastics

Natasha, the new gymnastics coach is making her mark running two early morning clubs for the keen and talented gymnasts. 40 children attend the weekly sessions.

Year 3/4 Gymnastics event. The A team came 13th and the B team came 12th. 33 schools entered.

Year 5 / 6 Gymnastics event. The A team finished 12th and the B team scored in 6th place but as they were an all girls' team they could not be officially placed

Indoor Athletics

Year 3 class hosted an Indoor Athletics match V St. Mary's ,Putney. 34 points to 30 to HG.

28 Year 5 and Year 6 children entered the area Indoor Athletics Competition. It clashed with the Year 6 entrance exams, giving other children a chance to get involved. The boys finished 4th and the girls finished 7th out of 12 schools.

24 Year 3 and Year 4 children participated in the area Indoor Athletics Competition. The girls finished 4th and the boys finished 1st. Overall HG came away with Bronze medals.

Football

The Year 6 girls' and boys 'football teams entered the Chelsea Foundation tournament. Both teams finished 2nd in their sections just missing out on places in the quarter-finals.

8 boys played in the football league at Sacred Heart. The competition ran over 7 weeks and the boys finished 4th.

Year 6 girls' football team played in the Battersea tournament and finished 4th.

The Year 5 boys and girls played matches against Honeywell.

Netball

Three netball teams were entered in the Wandsworth netball tournament. The Year 5 team qualified for the quarter-finals which was an excellent achievement – they were drawn to play against the A team. The B team played well, they won 1 , lost 1 and drew 1 but missed getting through by 1 goal. The A team beat the C team and went on to win their semi – final. They met The Roche in the final and were happy to win. This meant they would have to play the winners of the other heat to qualify for the London youth games. They met Sacred Heart and in a nail biting final lost 12-11 in extra time.

Four Year 3 and 4 teams played netball against Honeywell.

Multi -Sports Events

The Year 4 class were involved in a Sports Festival where they played netball, tag rugby and dodge ball against St. Mary's Putney.

Year 2 took part in an afternoon of activities at Honeywell.

10 Year 5 children participated in an afternoon of rugby and ball skills.

22 children entered the Battersea Fun Run.
